**Estimated population: 6 pairs, compared to 7 - 9 in recent years**

Four nests were found, three in use since at least 2020, and another since 2024, at Crumpsbrook. Five nests located in previous years were apparently not occupied, and another was not accessible. Observations suggest there are 1 – 2 nests still to find, at the top of Titterstone Clee Hill, and near Dhustone. Pairs are easier to locate if they are hunting to raise young, so the hot dry spring may have led to a poor breeding season.
